**PUBLIC FORUM:** Thom Marsh with Rotoform Molding Corporation was present to discuss moving forward with his new building located in the Industrial Park. The request to vacate several streets was mentioned, however there is still missing information regarding the City's utilities being under said streets. Supervisor Vanlangen will reach out to the City engineer and attorney to determine is the streets are able to be vacated.

**CITY ATTORNEY:** Raphael M. Montag Attorney at Law with Groves and Chizek Law Office, was in attendance at the council meeting to discuss possibly representing the City of Ellsworth moving forward. After speaking with the council

and obtaining his current fee schedule, there was a motion by Funk, seconded by Sogard to accept Mr. Montag's proposal for the City Attorney position. Roll call votes 3-0. Motion carried.

**BUDGET DISCUSSION:** Motion by Gelder, seconded by Sogard to approve the FY23/24 Library Budget request of \$44,955.00. Roll call votes 3-0. Motion carried

Motion by Sogard, seconded by Funk to approve the South Hamilton Post Prom donation of \$500.00 for FY22/23. Roll call votes 3-0. Motion carried.

**FINANCIAL ADVISOR ENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT FOR WATER TOWER PROJECT:** Motion by Gelder, Seconded by Funk to approve the engagement letter from Nathan Summers from UMB Financial Services to act as Municipal Advisor for the Water Tower Project. Roll call votes 3-0. Motion carried.
